With America's new issue about illegal immigration from the Mexican border, the main focus surrounds Mexicans. What about Central Americans migrating to the United States via Mexico? The Mexican migrants come to America to look for work, whereas the Central American migrants come to America for asylum. More Americans think Central Americans seeking asylum are more justifiable than Mexicans seeking work. How are Central American immigrants viewed both as their own group and in comparison with Mexicans?
