Larry Vale is Professor and Department Head, Department of Urban Studies and Planning in the School of Architecture and Planning at MIT. His current research focuses on disaster recovery, comparative housing redevelopment, and urban security. He holds an undergraduate degree from Amherst College, the S.M.Arch.S. degree from MIT, and a D.Phil from the University of Oxford. He has been a Rhodes Scholar and a Guggenheim Fellow, as well as the recipient of the 1997 Chester Rapkin Award from the Association of Collegiate Schools of Planning. In 1999, he was selected as a MacVicar Faculty Fellow, in recognition of his contributions to undergraduate education at MIT. His recent publications include *The Resilient City: How Modern Cities Recover from Disaster*, co-edited with Thomas J. Campanella (Oxford University Press, 2005), *Reclaiming Public Housing: A Half-Century of Struggles in Three Public Neighborhoods* (Harvard University Press, 2002), *Imaging the City: Continuing Struggles and New Directions*, co-edited with Sam Bass Warner, Jr. (Center for Urban Policy Research Press, 2001), and *From the Puritans to the Projects: Public Housing and Public Neighbors* (Harvard University Press, 2000).
